News from Sweden:

These wind turbines make the surrounding trees look tiny. In 2015 there were over 3,000 wind turbines in Sweden, and about 7% of the electricity comes from wind power. Sweden managed to reach its goal of a 50% renewable energy share several years ahead of the Swedish government's 2020 schedule, already in 2012. But we're not stopping there - we are raising the bar for the goal. Now we aim for 100% of energy production in Sweden to be renewable by 2040 (Embassy of Sweden in U.S.).

By 2070 Sweden's population is expected to reach 12.8 million, most from from immigration due to global conflicts and instability in other countries, and person interest in living in Sweden. In 2018 almost a quarter of the Swedish population, between age 20-64 were born outside Sweden and by 2030s will grow to 30% of the population. This rate of growth is expected to decrease.

The new 73-point budget program will focus on increasing the number of people in work, climate change, schools and education by hiring more assistants, assisting women's shelters, reducing domestic violence and increases for those with disabilities, free museums admission, expanding broadband, and more money for security.

News from Finland:

THE BIOPRODUCT MILL planned by Metsä Group in Kemi, Western Lapland, could complicate the coalition formation negotiations between the Social Democrats and Green League.

Antti Rinne, the chairperson of the Social Democrats, rushed to express his support for the 1.5 billion-euro construction project in <u>an interview on YLE TV1</u> on Saturday, affirming that it is possible to raise logging volumes to satisfy the needs of the plant in a way that is sustainable for the climate.

News from Denmark: LEGO is now piloting a new project that will use the bumps on their iconic bricks to help teach the Braille alphabet to blind and visually impaired children. LEGO "Braille Bricks" will be moulded with the same number of studs used for individual letters and numbers in the Braille alphabet, while remaining fully compatible with the LEGO System in Play. To ensure the tool is inclusive allowing sighted teachers, students and family members to interact on equal terms, each brick will also feature a printed letter or character.

News from Iceland: credit given to writer Anna Margret Björnsson


Húsavík, the" harbour of houses," is a pretty coastal town in the remote North of Iceland, less than an hour away by flight. Driving there from Reykjavík takes around nine hours and from Akureyri it's approximately one hour's drive.

Legend has it that the first ever home built in Iceland was that of Swedish Viking Garðar Svavarsson in the year 860. Húsavík is conveniently located for day trips to most of the major attractions in Iceland and is the starting point of the popular Diamond Circle.

Húsavík is also known as the town of whales, its main attraction being whale watching, as the likelihood of seeing various whale species, including the biggest whales such as blue whales, fin whales and humpback whales is great in the area, much more so than in South Iceland.

Also: Iceland has made it illegal to pay women less than men.
